Directors' Report to the Shareholders/Members for the year ended 31 st March, 2010

### Gentlemen,

The directors of your Corporation have pleasure in presenting to you the FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT on the working of the Corporation for the year ended 31 st March, 2010 together with the Audited Statement of Accounts.

# 1. Business Operations:

# 1.1 Canalisation of Liquor:

The Corporation maintained its policy of canalizing IMFL and Beer without interfering in the dynamics of the market place. As a result, the healthy competition prevailing amongst suppliers continued during the year.

With its past experience, the Corporation ironed out minor difficulties experienced by the industries in its policies. The corporation is constantly in touch with all its stakeholders and is ever ready to fine tue its policies for improving its response and operations.

# 1.2 Transparency in Operations / on line operation

The Corporation is carrying out its commercial activities throuth an online web based software which has enabled it to maintain total transparency in its operations. Suppliers and Excise Department have been given access on the Corporation's software for getting all sort of information like issuance of OFS, receipt of material at depot, sale of various brands, stock position of various brands, weekly payment, collection of excise duty etc. Simultaneously, copies of the ledgers are provided to respective retailers on monthly basis for their reconciliation purpose.

# 1.3 Infrastructure

In addition to basic facilities like furniture, telephone etc. all the depots have been equipped with computer. Internet connectivity and VSAT for running online software, Online UPS and Gensets for meeting power crisis.

# 1.4 Financial Management

A sound and prudent financial management is a major strength of the Corporation. The main commercial activity especially the purchase and sale of IMFL / Beer of the Corporation have been run real time on-line basis. This system has streamlined the working of the Corporation, the suppliers have been provided login / password facility to view their stock/sales position alongwith their due payment position, at any time / anywhere, heralding an era of real transparency in Corporation functioning.



The year under report experienced a significant change in the banking arrangements wherein the core banking solution (CBS) facilities extended by Punjab National Bank, Bank of India and UCO Bank have been availed at its optimum level. The daily customized banking statement sent by bank and its sorting out branch wise / depot wise using "software module" enabled daily deposit reconciliation at depots. It may be mentioned that through the CBS network (anywhere banking) only a single core account is maintained at Jaipur with the facility to the retailers to deposit the requisite amount anywhere throughout the State in over 175 authorized branches. The amount so deposited at any such branch gets instantly Credited in the central account being maintained at Jaipur. The notable feature of the above arrangement is converting any amount exceeding two lakh through smart-roamer scheme in FDR A/c automatically fetching interest with the kitty of the Corporation.

The time bound payments to suppliers and all other concerned parties have been the hallmark of operational efficiency of the Corporation. During the year Corporation started releasing due weekly suppliers payment fully through RTGS (Real Time Gross Settlement) dispensing with issuing of physical cheques to respective supplier.

### 1.5 Future Outlook

The fourth year of operations proved to be significant, as the Corporation successfully lived up to the confidence reposed by the Government. The policies hitherto adopted have yielded rich dividends and given its past record of implementing Government policies with a friendly face. Your Directors are confident that the Corporation would play a meaningful role in further reforms in the Excise sector.

### 2.1 Financial Performance:

The turnover of the Corporation during the year is Rs. 1956.66 crores (Including Vat) whereas last year it was Rs. 1597.54 crores. During the year Rs. 24.00 crores were paid as privilege fee as against of Rs. 26.00 crores in 2008-09.

The year witnessed an increase of 71.20 percent in interest earned. As against Rs. 1.91 crores earned as interest in 2008-09, the interest earned in this year is Rs. 3.27 crores.

### 2.2 Dividend:

The Board of Directors has recommended the dividend @ 10% on paid up capital. The dividend pay out will require an amount of Rs. 23,39,900 including dividend distribution tax.

During the year under review, there has been no change in the authorized capital of Rs. 5.00 crores of the Corporation and paid-up capital of Rs. 2.00 crores.

The turnover of the Corporation during the current year is Rs. 1956.66 crores (Including Vat) as compared to Rs. 1597.54 crores in previous year.

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of RAJASTHAN STATE BEVERAGES CORPORATION LIMITED, JAIPUR as at 31 March, 2010, the Profit and Loss Account and also the Cash Flow Statement of the Company for the year ended on that date annexed thereto. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Company's Management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Auditing Standards generally accepted in India. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatements. # Referred to our Report of even date

- (a) The Company has maintained proper records showing full particulars including quantitative details and situation of fixed assets except for depreciation charged on Assets.
  - (b) As explained to us the fixed assets have been physically verified at reasonable intervals by the management during the year. As certified by the management no material discrepancies have been noticed on such verification.
  - (c) No disposal of a substantial part of Fixed Assets of the Company has taken place during the year.
- 2. (a) According to explanations given to us, the Inventories of the company have been physically verified at reasonable intervals by the management.
  - (b) According to explanation given to us, the procedure of physical verification of Inventories followed by the management is reasonable and adequate in relation to the size of the Company and the nature of its Business.
  - (c) According to explanation given to us, the Company is maintaining proper records of Inventories through software application. No material discrepancies were noticed on physical verification of inventory.
- (a) The Company has neither granted or taken any loans, secured or unsecured from / to Companies, Firms or other parties covered in the register maintained under section 301 of the Companies Act, 1956.
  - (b) As the Company has neither granted or taken any loans, secured or unsecured from / to Companies, firms or other parties covered in the register maintained under section 301 of the Companies Act, 1956 hence clause 4(iii) (b) to (g) are not applicable.



- 4. In our opinion and according to the information and explanations given to us, there is an adequate internal control system commensurate with the size of the Company and the nature of its business for the purchase of inventories and fixed assets and also for the sale of goods and services. During the course of our audit, we have not observed any continuing failure to correct major weakness in internal control system.
- 5. There are no contracts or arrangements referred to in section 301 of the Companies Act, 1956. In view of the fact that there are no contracts or arrangement that needs to be entered into a register in pursuance of section 301 of the Companies Act, 1956, Sub clause 5(b) is not applicable.
- 6. The company has not accepted deposits from public and consequently, the directives issued by the Reserve Bank of India and the provisions of section 58A, 58AA or any other relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 1956 and the rules framed there under are not applicable.
- In our opinion, the Company has an internal audit system commensurate with the size and nature of its Business.
- The maintenance of cost records has not been prescribed by the Central Government under Section 209 (1) (d) of the Companies Act, 1956.
- 9. (a) As per information and explanations furnished to us and on the basis of our examination of the books of account, the Company has personnel deputed from other state government organization, in respect to whom all statutory payments with regard to Provident Fund, State Insurance have been made to the parent organization. The Company is generally regular in depositing undisputed Statutory dues relating to Income Tax, Sales Tax, Wealth Tax, Service Tax, Customs Duty, Excise duty, Cess and any other statutory dues to the extent applicable with the appropriate authorities. No Undisputed amounts payable in respect of the aforesaid dues were outstanding as at 31st March, 2010 for a period of more than six months from the date of becoming payable.
  - (b) According to the information and explanation given to us, there are no dues of Sales Tax, Income Tax, Customs duty, Wealth Tax, Excise Duty and Cess which have not deposited on account of any dispute except disputed



Service Tax of Rs.5,21,25,843/- relating to show cause notice issued by commissioner, Central Excise, Jaipur-1 for the period February,2005 to August, 2007 and a demand raised by Excise Department, Government of Rajasthan towards interest Rs.64,69,083/- on late deposit of permit fees and vend fees for financial years 2006 to 2008. The Income Tax department raised a demand of Rs 5,33,41,990/- for the Assessment Year 2006-2007 and Rs 6,70,20,550/- for the Assessment Year 2007-2008 disallowing the expenditure of Privilege Fees. A penalty of Rs. 1,00,000/- for the late filing of Return has been imposed for Assessment Year 2006-2007. The Corporation has deposited Rs 75 Lacs against the demands raised for Assessment Year 2006-2007 and 2007-2008. The matters are pending before appropriate authorities.

- 10. The Company does not have accumulated losses as at 31" March, 2010. The Company has not incurred cash losses during the financial year covered by the Audit but has incurred cash losses in the immediately preceding financial year.
- The Company has not defaulted in repayment of dues to financial Institutions or Banks or debenture holders.
- The Company has not granted any loans and advances on the basis of security by way of pledge of shares, debentures and other securities.
- 13. The Company is not a chit fund or a nidhi / Mutual benefit fund / Society. Hence, the provisions of clause 4(xiii) of the Companies (Auditor's Report) Order, 2003 are not applicable to the Company.

# ANNEXURE "B" TO THE AUDITORS' REPORT Referred to our Report of even date

- The details regarding entities falling under Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises
  Development Act, 2006 required to be disclosed have not been furnished.
  Therefore, the provisions of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Development
  Act, 2006 and the Companies Act, 1956 have not been complied with.
   The calculation of Income for the companies Act, 1956 have not been complied with.
- The calculation of Income from Demurrage Charges (Rs 3,82,78,932/-) has been done by the software of the corporation. However the records of Computation and Calculation were not made available to us for our verification at the time of audit. Profits cannot be ascertained.
   During the year under a size.
- 3. During the year under audit the corporation has changed the accounting policy in accounting of Purchases and Stock in Hand. However the change in accounting policy is not in accordance with the guidelines of the Liquor Sourcing Policy(LSP) which defines and governs the operations of the Corporation. Due to such a change the Cost of Sales has been inflated by a sum of Rs 1,27,74,82,226/- and the Stock in Hand as on 31.03.2010 has been inflated by a sum of Rs 1,32,68,78,625/-. However, it has no effect on the Profit of the current period. Similarly, due to change in accounting policy the balance of creditors has been inflated by a sum of Rs 1,32,68,78,625/-(Refer Point 4(a) of Notes on Accounts)
- 4. The Liquor Sourcing Policy for 2009-2010 has defined fixed margins on sales of FMFL and IMFL/Beer @7% and 2% respectively according to which the Gross Margins work out to Rs 30,83,93,161/-. However in the Profit & Loss Account for the year 2009-2010 the Gross Margins stand at Rs 30,77,05,384/-. The Gross Margin and Profit for the current year 2009-2010 has been understated by Rs 6,87,777/-

# NOTES ON ACCOUNTS AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES A.SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation of Financial Statements: 1.

The financial statements are prepared on an accrual basis and under historical cost convention and in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India, provision of the Companies Act, 1956, Liquor Sourcing Policy(LSP) and in compliance with mandatory accounting standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) except wherever otherwise stated.

### Method of Accounting: 2.

- Income recognition: i)
  - Sales: Sales invoicing and clearance of goods are done from the a) depots located across the state on software. There after on the basis of sales report generated from the above a single monthly entry for each depot is booked in the accounting software. Sales do not include inter-depot transfers and applicable VAT.
  - Interest on Fixed Deposit: Interest earned on Fixed Deposits with b) banks have been accounted for on accrual basis.
  - (c) Miscellaneous Receipts, Demurrage & Margin on drained/returned goods: Order For Supply (OFS) Extension, Transfer out order (TOO), Late Inward charge(LIC), Demurrage charges, Margin on drained/returned goods are accounted for/received/recovered as per the provisions of Liquor Sourcing Policy and terms & conditions of Agreement executed with suppliers/manufacturers, on accrual basis.
- Inventory.: Stock in hand are valued and stated at lower of cost or net ii) realisable value excluding VAT. The FIFO method of Inventories valuation is used to determine the cost.



Change in Accounting Policy:

During the year 2009-2010 policy related to accounting of Purchases and Stocks has been changed. Up to 2008-2009 purchases were recognized only as and when related sales occurred and stocks in hand were not accounted for in the books of accounts. From year 2009-2010 purchases have been recognized as and when goods are received and value of stocks in hand have also been accounted for. However, due to this change no effect on the current year Profit and Loss is observed.

# 4. Fixed Assets & Depreciation:

a) Fixed Assets:-The Gross Block of Fixed Assets is stated at cost of acquisition including any cost attributable to bringing the Assets to there working condition for there intended use. The Net Block is stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Depreciation:- Depreciation on Fixed Assets is provided on W.D.V. method as per the rates specified in schedule XIV of The Companies Act 1956. Depreciation in respect of additions is charged proportionately for the period from the date of its addition. Depreciation on assets, where actual cost does not exceed Rs. 5,000/- are depreciated 100% in the year of purchase itself.

# Personnel:

The Corporation has personnel's deputed from the Govt. of Rajasthan/State PSUD's. The Corporation has made remittances towards Pension Contribution, Provident Fund, Gratuity, State Insurance & Other contributions to the respective Departments/Parent Organizations in respect of the above personnel's.

# 6. Retirement Benefits:

As per the policy of Corporation all personnel are on deputation and are not recruited by Corporation Hence, there will not be any liability relating to retirement of the personnel. However the Pension contribution of Govt. employees on deputation is remitted to the Director Pension as per direction of State Government.

### 7. Taxation

- Provisions for Current Tax is made after taking into consideration benefits admissible under the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961, if any.
- Deferred Taxation: Deferred Tax resulting from "Timing differences" between books and taxable profits accounted using the Tax Rates and Laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted on the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are



recognized only if there is a reasonable certainty that they will be realized.

Deferred Revenue Expenditure:

Expenditure on building renovation is considered as deferred revenue expenditure & written off in the five years beginning with the year of its incidence.

9. Provisions, Contingent Liabilities & Contingent Assets

a) Provisions are recognized when the company has a present legal obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimation can be made from the amount of obligation.

b) Contingent Liabilities are not recognized but are disclosed in the notes to accounts, disputed demands in respect of Income Tax and Sales/Vat Tax etc. are disclosed as contingent liabilities. Payments in respect of such demands,

if any is shown as advance, till the final outcome of the matter.

 Contingent assets are neither recognized nor disclosed in the financial statements.



# Notes on Accounts

1. Nature of Operation

Rajasthan State Beverages Corporation Limited (RSBCL) has been incorporated as a Public Limited Company by the Government of Rajasthan with the object to control Liquor sales in the State of Rajasthan. RSBCL enjoys special privilege under the provisions of the Rajasthan Excise Act meaning thereby RSBCL has exclusive rights of wholesale Liquor trade in the State of Rajasthan for which it also pays "Privilege Fees" to the Government of Rajasthan as per the Excise Act. The operations of RSBCL are directed by LSP (Liquor Sourcing Policy) as framed from year to year. LSP for the current year 2009-2010 is as per Circular No RSBCL/LSP/2009-10/11074 dated 04.03.2009.

Procedure of Sourcing & Selling of Liquor

Manufacturer/supplier places an offer to supply liquor based on the demand prevailing in the respective locations. Thereafter, an order for supply (OFS) is issued to the manufacturer/supplier. Goods invoiced and supplied against OFS are stored in the depots of the Corporation. However, risk reward and ownership of such stocks vest in the supplier though RSBCL gets such stocks insured at its own cost. Manufacturer/ suppliers undertake the responsibility for creating demand for the goods supplied to the Corporation. Payment for the stocks supplied by the Manufacturer/ Suppliers is made only after such stocks are liquidated. Stocks remaining unsold after a specified period are subject to levy of demurrage charges or margin on drain out/return at rates contained in the LSP, the income of which is recognized in the books of accounts of RSBCL.

3. Method of Accounting

Goods are received against OFS at depots located across the state which is accounted for at respective depot locations on designated software after keeping into account the respective transit losses /shortages. Applicable Input Tax Credit (Rajasthan VAT), if any, is availed on such purchase as per the rules of Rajasthan VAT Act 2003 and Purchases are recognized in Profit & Loss Account excluding Rajasthan VAT. Goods are sold as per the guidelines suggested by LSP against VAT invoices and recognized in Profit & Loss Account excluding Rajasthan VAT. Hence, both sales and purchases are accounted for and recognized in P&L excluding VAT for which setoff is claimed as per Rajasthan VAT Rules. Records of individual sales, purchases, stock are kept and accounted for at respective depots, However, financial accounting is done and records are kept at Head Office in Jaipur. Valuation of Stock in hand at the year end is done in accordance with Point No 2(ii) Method of Accounting of Significant Accounting Policies



Up to financial year 2008-09 purchases were recognized in the books of accounts only after relevant sales were made after adjusting margin as allowed by the LSP. Stock in hand though was stored in RSBCL godowns were not accounted for in the books of accounts of RSBCL because as per LSP all the stock belongs to the manufacturer/supplier. No local Sales Tax was applicable till 2008-09.

# 4. Method of Accounting vis-à-vis LSP

The method of accounting, ownership of goods, income and expense recognition followed varies with the rules, regulations, procedures enumerated in the LSP. The details are as under:-

- a) Stock in hand as on 01.04.09: Up to 2008-09 the ownership of stock was recognized as per LSP, therefore stocks in hand as on 31.03.09 were not recognized as closing stock in the financial statement for the year 2008-09 (refer point no. 3 of Notes on accounts). However due to change in accounting policy by RSBCL such Goods (Rs1,27,74,82,226) were accounted as purchases and included in Cost of Sales in the current year 2009-10. However, as per LSP ownership of stocks in the RSBCL godown vests in the supplier / manufacturer.
- b) Purchases: For change in method of accounting of purchases w.e.f. 2009-10 refer point no. 3 of Notes on accounts.
- Stock in hand as on 31.03.2010 (Rs.1,32,68,78,625): Up to 2008-09 the stock in hand as on the end of the year were not recognized in the financial statements in accordance with the guidelines of the LSP. However w.e.f. 2009-10 stock in hand as at the end of the year (31.03.2010) has been accounted for in the books of accounts and included in the preparation of the financial statement. All stocks in the RSBCL godowns belong to the supplier / manufacturer.
- d) Demurrage Charges (Rs.3,82,78,932):-RSBCL has recovered demurrage charges in accordance to the LSP as the burden of sales of stocks to the retailers is with the supplier / manufacturer and not with RSBCL. Such stock, although "Purchased" in the books of RSBCL attracts demurrage charges as per LSP.

# 5. Contingent Liability not provided for:

- Estimated amount of contracts remaining to be executed on capital account Rs. NIL (Previous Year Rs. NIL)
- b) The Claims not accepted and not provided:- A claim of Rs 8.92 Lacks raised



by one of the contractors Ms.Anu Gupta is pending for decision before the Honorable High Court, Jaipur.

- The Commissioner of Central Excise Jaipur-I show-caused and raised a Demand of Rs. 5,21,25,843.00 on the Gross Margin towards service tax under the Service Tax Category Business Auxiliary Services up to August 2007. RSBCL has gone into appeal against this order before the Service Tax Tribunal, New Delhi and has not provided for in the books of accounts. The matter is not yet decided. Further on the same basis, service tax (excluding interest) on the Gross Margin for the period from September 2007 to March 2009 amounting to Rs. 5,67,90,707/- and for 2009-2010 Rs 3,17,34,375/- has not been provided for in the books of accounts since till date no demand for the same has been raised by the department.
- d) The Excise Department, Government of Rajasthan Jaipur raised demand of Rs. 64,69,083/- towards interest on late payment of permit and vend fees for the Financial Year 2006-07(Rs,32,89,550) and 2007-08(Rs 31,79,533). However, the Corporation made representations for deletion of the demand, the decision of which is still awaited.
- e) The Income Tax Department for the Assessment Year 2006-07 raised a demand of Rs. 5,33,41,990/- disallowing the expenditure of Privilege Fee treating the same as expenditure of Capital Nature. Also, for the same Assessment Year 2006-07 a penalty of Rs.1,00,000/- was imposed for late filing of income tax return. However, on appeal the C.I.T. (Appeals) II decided the matter in favour of the Corporation and turned down the demand of Rs 5,33,41,990/- .The Income Tax Department went into appeal in the matter in ITAT, Jaipur Bench "B" Jaipur. On 20.08.2010 ITAT dismissed the appeal of the Income Tax Department deciding the case in favour of the Corporation.

Again, on the same lines for the assessment Year 2007-2008, expenditure of Privilege Fee was disallowed treating it as expenditure of Capital Nature, the assessing authority has raised a demand of Rs.6,70,20,550/- for which the corporation has gone into appeal with the designated authority. However, the Corporation has deposited a sum of Rs. 50.00 Lacs and Rs 25.00 Lacs for Assessment Year 2006-07 and Assessment Year 2007-2008 respectively against the above demands.

 The calculation of Income from Demurrage (Rs.3,82,78,932) has been done by software in accordance with the LSP. However due to un-avoidable reasons the details of computation of demurrage receipt is not available with the corporation.



- 7. Entry for sales, purchase, inventory, other income (demurrage, RSBCL margin) is done in the accounting software (Tally) on the basis of reports generated by the software. A difference of Rs.6,87,777 (Short in books of accounts) is observed in the gross margin reports generated by software and books of accounts.
- The deferred revenue expenditure (Rs 5, 62,135) on account of building renovation which is written off during the year.
- 9. A sum of Rs. 47,65,578/-on account of Demurrage Receipt for the year 2009-10 is levied on one of the suppliers M/s Rajasthan State Ganganagar Sugar Mills Ltd. However the Board of Directors of the Corporation has waived off the same being the supplier is a Government Company.
- 10. Privilege Fee of Rs. 24.00 Crores has been paid to the Government of Rajasthan during the year 2009-10. License Fees Rs. 21,88,0000 includes application fees of Rs.3,80,000 also paid to the Government of Rajasthan during the year 2009-10.
- 11. The Government of Rajasthan on 31.08.09 introduced a Composite Tax Scheme (Sales Tax) for retailers with retrospective effect from 01.04.09 and entrusted the Corporation to recover the applicable Sales Tax from the retailers and deposit it accordingly. Since then RSBCL recovered and deposited a sum of Rs. 34,09,43,088 with the Commercial Taxes Department.
- In the opinion of the Board, Current Assets, Loans and Advances have a realisable value in the ordinary course of business at least equal to the amount at which they are stated.
- The Debit /Credit balances of Sundry Debtors, Sundry Creditors, Loans and Advances, Bank balances are subject to reconciliation and confirmation.
- 14. The Company's primary (business) segment is singular viz liquor. Therefore Segment information as per Accounting Standard-17 in respect thereof is not furnished.
- 15. The stock in hand as on 31.03.2010 is taken at values as certified by the Management of the Corporation. The valuation has been done in accordance with AS-2 as issued by Institute of Chartered Accountant of India (ICAI)
- 16. As per accounting standard-18, issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountant of India (ICAI), the disclosures of transaction with the related parties as defined in the accounting standard are given below:

Income Tax department raised a demand of Rs 5,33,41,990/- for the Assessment Year 2006-2007 and Rs 6,70,20,550/- for the Assessment Year 2007-2008 disallowing the expenditure of Privilege Fees. A penalty of Rs. 1,00,000/- for the late filing of Return has been imposed for Assessment Year 2006-2007. The corporation has deposited Rs 75 Lacs against the demands raised for Assessment Year 2006-2007 and 2007-2008. The matters are pending before appropriate authorities.

Regarding demand of Rs.5.33,41,990/- the appeal was decided in the favour of Corporation but the Income Tax Department has appealed before ITAT (Income Tax Appellate Tribunal). The appeal of the Income Tax Department has been dismissed by the ITAT on 20.08.10

 The Company does not have accumulated losses as at 31st March, 2010. The Company has not incurred cash losses during the financial year covered by the Audit but has incurred cash losses in the immediately preceding financial year. No comment.

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# REPLY OF AUDITOR'S REPORT (ANNEXURE-B)

## AUDITOR'S REPORT

#### REPLY

- The details regarding entities falling under 1. Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Development Act, 2006 required to be disclosed have not been furnished. Therefore, the provisions of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Development Act, 2006 and the Companies Act, 1956 have not been complied with.
- The calculation of Income from Demurrage 2. Charges (Rs 3,82,78,932/-) has been done by the software of the corporation. However, the records of Computation and Calculation were not made available to us for our verification at the time of audit. Therefore resultant impact of calculation differences, if any, on the current year profits cannot be ascertained.
- During the year under audit the corporation 3. has changed the accounting policy in accounting of Purchases and Stock in hand. However the change in accounting policy is not in accordance with the guidelines of the Liquor Sourcing Policy(LSP) which defines and governs the operations of the Corporation. Due to such a change the Cost of Sales has been inflated by a sum of Rs 1,27,74,82,226/- and the Stock in hand as on 31.03.2010 has been inflated by a sum of Rs 1,32,68,78,625/- . However it has no effect on the Profit of the current period. Similarly, due to change in accounting policy the balance of creditors has been inflated by a sum of Rs 1,32,68,78,625/-(Refer Point 4a of Notes on Accounts)
- The Liquor Sourcing Policy for 2009-2010 has defined fixed margins on sales of FMFL and IMFL/Beer @7% and 2% respectively according to which the Gross Margins work out to Rs 30,83,93,161/-. However in the Profit & Loss Account for the year 2009-2010 the Gross Margins stand at Rs 30,77,05,384/- The Gross Margin and Profit for the current year 2009-2010 has been understated by Rs 6,87,777/-

Corporation has been pursuing with the respective parties to provide the requisite information. Till date no party has claimed to be MSMED category. However it is on record that Corporation follows a unique payment system normally releasing due payment to any supplier on weekly basis through RTGS as per Liquor Sourcing Policy. Generally due payment is made within stipulated limit of the Act. Hence, the tenet and proviso of Act is being followed.

The previous software service provider's contract has ended and new firm has taken over the work. The old vendor did not provide the required software/programme, therefore information could not be made available. Calculation at the level of RSBCL was done. Before handover/ takeover of contract sample check was done by the Auditors.

The Government of Rajasthan introduced VAT (Sales Tax) on the sale of Liquor/Beer w.e.f. 01.04.09. The Corporation, is therefore liable for accounting the stock, sale, purchase etc. as per the VAT Act. Therefore, it was compulsory to take all the stocks into books of accounts as purchase and to book the purchase as per invoices raised by the suppliers to take the input tax credit as per the provisions of VAT.

The Corporation is in process of reconciliation of the records. After due reconciliation it will be accounted for in current year books of accounts.
